"WHY WE HAVE PRIDE" 25 YEARS OF PRIDE IN WEST VIRGINIA

Why do we have Pride, year after year? Well, coming out to yourself and to others is a daily process.

Rainbow Pride of WV has events every month. We have these events for the LGBTQ community and the allied community to promote LGBTQ awareness to the general community and also to and for ourselves.

We had a beginning. Twenty five years ago, John Brown, David Shumate, and Andy Ragland thought it was a good idea to have a Gay Pride Parade in Charleston, West Virginia. The word got around and a small group was formed. This group was called the Pride Committee of West Virginia.

The fundraising mechanism that this committee thought of was to sell ads in a publication about the upcoming Parade. My friend, Jeff Huff was on this committee. He got me to donate \$75.00. The first Pride Guide came out and my name was not in the Pride Guide as a donor. It was explained to me that the committee did discuss the situation and determined that they would have to print a loose sheet to the Pride Guide since the Pride Guide was already printed. The committee decided not to print the extra sheet. This is the first lesson of being on the committee.

The next year, Jeff Huff got me and another friend of mine, Bruce Severino to join the committee. At the first meeting of the second year of the Pride Committee, Jeff Huff proposed a garden in memory of those who died of AIDS. So, Jeff, Bruce and I got aother group together and formed the Living AIDS Memorial Garden.

Also in the second year of the Pride Committee, Jeremy Burdette and Kevin McClelland proposed a competition (pageant) for an ambassador for the Pride Committee. The competition would encourage state-wide involvement by having mini-pageants (preliminaries) throughout the state. The Miss Pride Pageant was born. For the first Miss Pride pageant there were eleven contestants.

David Shumate also helped form the Prime Timers and Mountain State Bears.

The Pride Committee evolved into the Rainbow Pride of West Virginia in order to file for 501(c)3 status. We hired an CPA from Atlanta who had experienced with filing 501(c)3 for Pride groups. From forming the new organization to finally receiving our 501(c)3 status, it took us five years.

And this is only the beginning . . .

The rest of the story will have to come later.

This year, we have over fifty ads in the Pride Guide and 18 sponsors. We would like to thank all our supporters that supports us throughout the 25 years.

We have had many people who were members, board members, and officers. We are all volunteers. And it is a thankless job. But sometimes, you do get recognized. There have been a few "volunteers" of Pride who were honored with the Power of One. Please see next page.

QUEER YOUTH

Being a kid is tough. But being a queer kid in rural Appalachia? That's its own kind of tough.

In places like West Virginia, LGBTQ+ youth often find themselves isolated and cut off from peers who are like them. That isolation can lead to despair, and worse.

At the American Civil Liberties Union of West Virginia, we know the struggle for full equality won't be won today. And we know that once that equality is secured, it will have to be defended in the courts, in legislatures, and in the streets.

So, we launched the Appalachian Queer Youth Summit, a summer-camp style program that brings LGBTQ+ youth and youth from LGBTQ+ families together from all over the state. We're breaking down those barriers that make young people feel so alone. We're also helping to guide the next generation of activists along the way.

Fifteen campers attended our first-ever in-person Summit in August at Camp Virgil Tate in Kanawha County. There were water balloons, crafts, s'mores, and campfire songs. But there was also political education and power-building. Most importantly, there was freedom to be our authentic selves.

One camper told us it was the safest, most empowering space he had ever been in. Another said he hadn't smiled so much in years. But everyone agreed: next year's camp must be longer.

TRANSGENDER HEALTH

Fairness West Virginia, the statewide civil rights advocacy group for LGBTQ people in the Mountain State, released last year an interactive health guide to ensure our transgender community members know which doctors provide competent and compassionate care. The guide, which can be viewed online at www.fairnesswv.org, lists dozens of providers and clinics that have received direct training from Fairness staff.

"This is just the beginning," said Andrew Schneider, executive director of Fairness West Virginia. "We will continue to train medical providers and their staff over the coming year, and we hope to double the number of providers we currently have on our list. Everyone deserves access to competent and compassionate care, and we owe it to our transgender friends and neighbors to make sure they can access the services they need."

Fairness conducts an annual Transgender Health Survey each year. Close to 45 percent of respondents of this year's survey said medical or mental health providers have discriminated against them, and 17 percent said they were outright refused care.

"It's unconscionable that anyone can be turned away from getting the care they need in the middle of a pandemic, but that's happening," Schneider said. "Without laws to protect against discrimination like the Fairness Act, doctors and hospitals can continue to legally discriminate against LGBTQ people just because of who we are or who we love."

Of the survey respondents who knew about the guide, slightly more than 60 percent said they have referenced the guide while seeking care and 35 percent said it has helped them find a new provider. Two-thirds of respondents plan to use the guide when finding a provider in the future.

We are asking for donations for the Living AIDS Memorial Garden

Improvement Project. The project is our recommitment of our mission to establish and maintain a garden in memory of those who have died of AIDS, and to provide a place of reflection for those who are living with AIDS, and for those who are survivors.

The centerpiece of the improvement project is the "Red Ribbon" sculpture. The red ribbon is the international symbol of HIV/AIDS awareness. This metal sculpture will be ten feet in height and will be visible from Washington Street East and Sidney Avenue. The noted sculptor of the "Red Ribbon" is Jeff Fetty of Spencer, West Virginia.

The other elements of the improvement project are the following items: refinish the surfaces of the 2 plaques in the Garden, the repair of the wood tables and benches, the installation of new armrests at the benches, the installation of new signs, the installation of new wrought iron fencing at the back of the Garden, the installation of sod, the installation of exterior lights to illuminate the sculpture, a new plaque for the sculpture and the installation of new speakers and sound system.

Covenant House and the LGBTQ Community

Covenant House has operated for 40 years with a focus on homelessness and support for marginalized people. Born from grassroots efforts of the local faith communities, their focus has always been on local and regional issues. Taking action through advocacy and raising awareness of the struggle facing the poor in our area neighborhoods, Covenant House built programs with grant funding by targeting those areas of need.

During the onset of the AIDS pandemic they faced fearful backlash in their effort to establish three homes for persons with HIV who had nowhere else to go. This effort developed to encompass twenty-two counties of southern West Virginia yielding housing support including utilities, rent, and basic living supplies.

Later, additional funding led to the creation of a statewide effort to raise awareness of tobacco use and the malevolent targeting of LGBT folk by the tobacco industry. Through this grant they have created a website: drrainbow.org which allows for one to search for area physicians who are "gay friendly" and nonjudgmental. The site also offers help with tobacco cessation and general LGBTQ activities within the community.

Most recently they have begun a partnership with West Virginia Health Right and the Ryan White program to increase HIV testing throughout the region in light of the outbreaks of HIV infection fueled by the surge in IV drug usage. These plans will ultimately culminate in Covenant House becoming a LGBTQ health center with comprehensive health and behavioral health support offered five days a week.

Healthcare Options for the LGBTQ Community

WV Health Right is the state's oldest and largest free and charitable clinic which provides comprehensive primary and specialty care to over 29,000 impoverished uninsured/underinsured adults throughout the region. The clinic was founded and continues to operate on the philosophy that every person is entitled to quality healthcare regardless of financial or insurance status. WV Health Right began offering healthcare to the homeless more than 38 years ago and has grown to a major healthcare hub for comprehensive services throughout 34 south-central counties in West Virginia. The clinic now offers a patient-centered medical home complete with primary care, dental, vision, behavioral health, substance use disorder treatment, health education classes, and specialty services to meet the needs of the underserved population throughout the region.

In a continued effort to ensure health equity among the entire population served by WV Health Right, the clinic has expanded services to include a comprehensive off-site clinic at Covenant House which offers new health-care options focused on providing care to the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning/queer (LGBTQ) community. The clinic offers comprehensive healthcare to the targeted population of LGBTQ patients that are seeking healthcare options in an all-inclusive environment that is welcoming to anyone in need. The clinic also serves as a patient-centered medical home and offers various other services, including testing for viral infections such as Hepatitis B and C and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) as well as vaccinations and pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP). The clinic continues to offer an array of counseling and recovery options, including access to medication assisted treatment (MAT) and wraparound services to ensure that overall care of the patient is maintained at the highest quality standards.

The expanded program is now offering dedicated healthcare services five days per week at the off-site satellite clinic at Covenant House, the city's largest drop-in service center for the homeless and those at risk of homelessness. The Covenant House location provides dedicated space for comprehensive clinic services as an alternate option for healthcare from the main clinic site. The new expansion of resources includes opportunities to staff the clinic with highly trained healthcare professionals providing a focus on the specific needs of the LGBTQ community, which currently makes up at least 27% of the patient population that call WV Health Right their medical home provider. The clinic works to increase healthcare services to the targeted population, reduce the harmful behaviors related to substance use disorder that disproportionally affects LGBTQ patients, and increases access to health education and prophylactic treatment among those affected, thereby reducing the incidence of sexually transmitted infections.

"WV Health Right is committed to meeting the needs of the entire community, and we are excited for the opportunity to offer expanded care to the LGBTQ population," says Dr. Angie Settle, CEO of WV Health Right.
